Brief Description of Position:

Under the direction of the assigned supervisor, perform specialized health services for students in regular education and special education programs; communicate with parents, school site, and district personnel on health related matters; assist with medical screening of students, disseminate health information, provide emergency medical care, and perform related duties

Directly Responsible to:

Appropriately assigned supervisor

Major Duties and Responsibilities:

- 1. Performs specialized health services to students including but not limited to toileting assistance, catheterization, gavage feeding, ostomy care and suctioning, monitoring students on oxygen and ventilators
- 2. Maintain health records
- 3. Provide emergency medical care in the event of serious illness or accident
- 4. Administer medication as appropriate pursuant to physician's instructions and District protocols
- 5. Coordinate necessary health conferences with parents, staff, and community resources
- 6. Prepare reports for district, county, and state agencies
- 7. Reproduce a variety of instructional media materials as requested
- 8. Administer medication as appropriate
- 9. Assist student to develop self-control and self-esteem
- 10. Maintain professional competence through continuing education course work or experience
- 11. May lift disabled students in and out of holding or locomotive devices and on and off buses
- 12. May make minor adjustments on special equipment, such as wheel chairs, crutches, braces, standing tables, and gurneys
- 13. Perform related duties as assigned

- Interact with students, parents, and staff in a patient, warm, friendly manner
- Communicate clearly and effectively verbally and in writing
- Deal with stressful situations in a calm, professional manner
- Be flexible in scheduling workload
- Assist disabled student in area related to activities of daily function such as feeding, toileting, exercises, and positioning
- Lift and move students safely
- Bend, kneel, stoop, and crawl
- Push and pull wheelchairs
- Dispense medication pursuant to physician's instructions
- Observe health and safety regulations and reporting requirements
- Work effectively with constant interruptions
- Understand and follow oral and written directions
- Work cooperatively with others
- Work independently with little direction
- Physical stamina sufficient to sit, stand, or walk for prolonged periods of time
- Mobility to traverse all areas of the work site
- Manual dexterity sufficient to provide medical treatments, write and use business machines
- Lift object weighing up to 25 pounds
- Meet schedules and timelines
- Plan and organize work

Experience and Education:

High school diploma or evidence of equivalent educational proficiency; one year experience in a nursing or medical service program, including some clerical and/or record keeping experience; evidence of continuing education in the medical field; work experience with school-age children is highly desirable

License/Other Requirements:

- Must possess of valid California Driver's License during course of employment; must be insurable at standard rates and maintain such insurability during the course of employment;
- An automobile used in the course of work that meets the current legal requirements for vehicle operation in the State of California, including proof of insurance
- A current DMV driving report is required prior to employment
- A current California Licensed Vocational Nurse or Registered Nurse License
- A current First Aid Certificate
- A current CPR Certificate

Working Conditions:

School site and District office environment; during emergency situations, would be required to attend to the injured party either indoors or outside; subject to lifting, bending, pushing and carrying
