# **BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF POSITION**

Under the direction of the Coordinator of Teaching and Learning, Supplemental, the Elementary VAPA Specialist provides specialized expertise in Music through the use of the Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA) Content Standards and Framework for California Public Schools. Supports sequential standards-based Music instruction for students. Creates a flexible elementary grade program and a class environment favorable to learning and personal growth. Establishes effective rapport with students to motivate them to develop skills, attitudes, and knowledge needed to provide a good foundation for further participation in the total school program, in accordance with each student's ability and to meet the VAPA Content Standards for California in Music. Establishes good relationships with parents and other staff members.

### **REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES**

The position includes but is not limited to the following list of representative duties:

- Teach skills in general music appreciation, explorations in music, and in instrumental music (band, other instrumental ensembles as determined necessary), as outlined by the Visual and Performing Arts Content Standards for California in Arts standards, as adopted by the SMBSD Board of Education.
- Develops student musicians from beginning fundamental instrument techniques through increasingly advanced levels of performance.
- Utilizes courses of study adopted by the Board of Education and other appropriate learning activities.
- Recruit students to instrumental music programs.
- Instruct pupils in citizenship and basic subject matter specified in state law and administrative regulations and procedures of the school.
- Plans a balanced music program, and organizes daily class time so that preparation, rehearsal, and instruction can be accomplished within the allotted time.
- Provides individual and small group instruction in order to adapt the curriculum to the needs of each pupil.
- Utilizes repertoire of all types of music literature, including traditional and contemporary, that are appropriate for the ages and skill levels of pupils.
- Controls the storage and use of school-owned property; makes music-related purchases; makes minor adjustments and requests repairs to instruments as required.
- Establishes and maintains standards of pupil behavior to provide an orderly, productive environment during practice, group rehearsals, and music performances.
- Evaluate each pupil's musical growth and performance, assessing each individual's contribution to the performance of the group.
- Plans, rehearses and directs pupils in musical programs for school and community.
- Selects and requisitions books, musical instruments, and instructional aids; maintains required inventory records.
- Communicate with parents, school counselors, and teachers on pupil progress.

- Identifies pupil needs and cooperates with other professional staff members in helping pupils solve health, attitude, and learning challenges.
- Cooperates with school administration and district-wide teams in providing musical programs for school productions, district competitions, graduation ceremonies, and civic functions.
- Supervises pupils in out-of-classroom activities during the assigned work day.
- Participates in curriculum and other developmental programs and showcases.
- Participates in faculty committees and sponsorship of student activities.
- Maintains professional competence through in-service education activities provided by the school, and/or in self-selected professional growth activities.
- Participates cooperatively with the appropriate administrator to participate in the process by which he/she will be evaluated in conformance with school guidelines.
- Perform other duties as assigned.

## **OTHER RELATED DUTIES:**

- Attend appropriate in-service training, workshops, and meetings, as assigned, to keep informed of current practices and trends in education;
- Perform other related duties as may be assigned by administration in compliance with Board policies and administrative regulations, the Master Contract, and State regulations.

# KNOWLEDGE OF:

- Standards-based instruction, curriculum design, effective instructional strategies and techniques, assessment tools, and professional development delivery systems specifically in the visual and performing arts disciplines;
- Effective classroom management techniques;
- Social-emotional needs of students, along with an understanding of how to support student social-emotional development needs;
- Strong knowledge of culturally responsive teaching;
- Effective strategies for meeting the needs of various learners, including English language learners;
- Curriculum, instruction, and assessment processes and how they should operate in an effective school;
- Applicable sections of State Education Code and other applicable state publications, such as curriculum frameworks;
- Technology and computer software applications relative to instruction and administration;
- California Standards for the Teaching Profession.
