THE POSITION

The River Delta Unified School District is seeking a superintendent who possesses the skills to continue to keep the focus of the staff, parents, and community on *students*. The new superintendent will build upon the history and tradition of the District to continue a collaborative and supportive environment with high standards and high expectations for students. Along with strong leadership skills, the right candidate will enjoy interacting with the people that live and work in the District's various small communities.

The successful candidate must possess the knowledge and skills to administer all aspects of a small school district with a small district staff: curriculum, human resources, special education, finance, public relations, parent communication, and facilities. The successful candidate will assume leadership of the District on July 1, 2019.

THE COMMUNITY

The River Delta Unified School District is located in three counties—Sacramento, Solano, and Yolo. Although it is a tri-county district, it is served by the Sacramento County Office of Education.

The District is situated in a rural area, with over 1,000 miles of waterways in the Sacramento River Delta. Though rural, it is close to major metropolitan regions including Sacramento, Stockton, Fairfield, and the San Francisco Bay Area. Lake Tahoe and the High Sierra are within easy driving distance.

The District itself lies in the heart of a great recreational area. With the maze of rivers and sloughs that make up the Delta, boating, water skiing, swimming, and fishing are favorite pastimes. The major industry is agriculture, utilizing some of the richest farm land in the United States to produce pears, tomatoes, grapes, and grains.

THE DISTRICT

The Sacramento Delta area where the San Joaquin and Sacramento Rivers converge is unique with its culture and traditions. The history of the Chinese and Japanese settlers is still alive in the buildings constructed over 100 to 150 years ago. Within the River Delta Unified School District, one can find inviting, narrow streets shaded by large, overhanging trees.

The District office is located in Rio Vista which is 45 miles northeast of San Francisco and 35 miles southwest of Sacramento. River Delta is a K–12 district with an enrollment of 1,910. The District has 8 small schools: 4 K–6 elementary schools; 2 middle schools; and 2 high schools serving the communities of Clarksburg, Hood, Courtland, Walnut Grove, Ryde, Locke, Isleton, Rio Vista, Birds Landing, and Collinsville.

The student population is 23.5% English learners and 64.7% socioeconomically disadvantaged. The District is making good progress in closing the achievement gap. There are 242 employees. The dedicated teachers and staff are devoted to the instruction of the students and work to create a positive and safe learning environment. Many of the district employees attended schools in the district and now work at those schools.

Strong parent and community involvement make the District unique. It is the expectation that all administrators participate in District events and establish relationships with the families and community members of this socioeconomically and ethnically diverse cultural area. The small size of the schools allows for personalized communication.

The District is proud of the unique characteristics found within its varied communities. A strong leader is required to address the needs of each community while promoting a common vision for the River Delta Unified School District.
