1. **Grow Professionally:** Stay knowledgeable about current educational best practices through learning, practicing and reflecting in order to remain a lifelong learner.
 - a. Learning examples: Forums, conferences, coursework, literature, professional organizations
 - b. Practicing examples: goal setting; observation; student work; measurable growth for goals
 - c. Reflecting examples: professional blog, website, journal

Methods of Measurement

- Self-reflections, goals, activity logs
- Observations

- 2. Use Best Practices in the Classroom:** In an ongoing and timely manner, analyze, design, manage, assess and document student learning.
- a. Analyze: Identify student academic level and learning style
 - b. Design: Use Common Core Standards and JCS scope and sequence to develop lessons using various digital tools and resources
 - c. Management:
 - i. Consistently monitor and enforce behavior expectations.
 - ii. Use a classroom schedule and routines to ensure appropriate coverage of all learning targets.
 - iii. Use different teaching models (Group Investigation, Advanced Organizers, Cooperative Learning, project-based learning, Socratic Dialogue, Inquiry, etc.) to personalize and guide student learning.
 - d. Assess:
 - i. Create and use formative and summative assessments to guide instructional decisions.
 - ii. Provide constructive feedback to students in a timely manner.
 - e. Document:
 - i. Complete necessary requirements and documentation for attendance, learning period reporting and report cards.
 - ii. Use assessment data to seek and find students needing intervention.
 - iii. Participate as an IEP or 504 team member for students on roster.

Methods of Measurement:

Observations (formal, coach, peer)
Self Critiques (video, reflections)
Review of paperwork

- 3. Impact Student Learning:** Provide evidence to demonstrate student academic growth through assessment data, as well as professional communication and interaction.
- a. Student Growth Data: Multiple measures of assessment that may include standardized testing, schoolwide benchmarks, schoolwide diagnostic testing (e.g. RP), teacher created formative and summative assessments, rubrics, writing samples
 - b. Professional Communication & Interaction: Regularly communicates schoolwide, roster specific and individual student information to influence attitudes towards learning in a responsive and timely manner.

Methods of Measurement:

- Assessment results, data analysis, learning plans, student products
- Parent/Student Surveys

- 4. Collaborate with Colleagues:** Actively contribute and participate in teams and projects with your colleagues to improve student learning and success.
- a. Professional Learning Communities
 - b. Cross-curricular projects
 - c. Grade level or subject teams

Methods of Measurement

- Peer surveys
- Self-reflections
- Coordinator and/or team lead surveys

- 5. Contribute to the School Community:** Actively support the program philosophy and culture. Meet schoolwide professional expectations.
- a. Program culture - be an active member of the academy culture
 - i. attend and participate in program activities
 - ii. understand and impact the community
 - b. Program expectations
 - i. model and embrace the philosophy of the program
 - ii. contribute to program meetings and responsibilities
 - iii. comply with coordinator expectations
 - c. Professional expectations
 - i. maintain high levels of communication with colleagues, supervisors, and administrators.
 - ii. attend and participate in schoolwide meetings and events
