DEFINITION:

Plans and teaches a balanced band program including all contemporary band instruments for students in the upper elementary grades at multiple elementary school sites within the district. Teacher is responsible for music education of pupils at the elementary level, and assists the staff of the school in the improvement and appreciation of music instruction. Helps pupils grow in their enjoyment, appreciation, and performance of music through a variety of planned music experiences which include singing, moving to music, playing of instruments and listening and performs other duties directly related to this job description.

EXAMPLE OF DUTIES/RESPONSIBILITIES:

» Duties

1. Recruits students to participate in the band program.
2. Organizes daily class instruction for regular teaching and assessment, as well as performance preparations to be accomplished within the allotted time.
3. Provides individual and small group instruction in order to adapt the curriculum to meet the needs of a diverse group of students with varying intellectual and artistic abilities.
4. Instructs students in proper use and maintenance of their musical instruments and equipment.
5. Maintains an organized storage area and proper inventory control to prevent loss or damages.
6. Establishes and maintains standards of pupil behavior to provide an orderly, safe, and productive environment.
7. Reviews and recommends books, music, musical instruments and other resources as needed.
8. Facilitates minor instrument repairs and requests professional services for repairs when necessary.
9. Plans, rehearses, and directs students in musical performances for the school and community.
10. Collaborates with the middle and high school band directors for on-going curriculum assessment and overall program recruitment and improvement.
11. Communicates with parents and appropriate school personnel regarding student progress and other related program activities.
12. Cooperates with site administrators, faculty, and staff concerning rehearsal facilities, special performances, and other site and performing arts activities.
13. Maintain professional competence through in-service education, professional development and self-reflection.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

Experience:

1. Instrumental music teaching experience at the elementary level.
2. Experience in working with students of diverse social and ethnic backgrounds.

CREDENTIAL REQUIREMENTS:
