WHO CAN ATTEND

The Riverside County Education Academy targets expelled students from a school district for any reason other than those specified in subdivision (a) or (c) of Section 48915.

Referred to county community schools by a school district as a result of the

recommendation by a school attendance review board or pupils whose school districts of attendance have, at the request of the pupil's parent or guardian, approved the pupil's enrollment in a county community school.

- (1) Probation-referred pursuant to Sections 300, 601, 602, and 654 of the Welfare and Institutions Code.
- (2) On probation or parole and not in attendance in any school.
- (3) Expelled for any of the reasons specified in subdivision (a) or (c) of Section 48915.
- (4) Homeless children.
